Background


Article 9. State policy in the sphere of local self-government

- 2. In preparation and adoption of decisions on matters directly affecting the interests of local communities, public authorities shall conduct consultations and discussions with the bodies of LSG and their associations, unions of local communities in the order established by the law.”
- **The order hasn't been established!**
- Numerous RLAs are adopted one after another. However, the situation on the ground, as well as their impact on the communities, are not deeply studied, opinions of the LSG representatives are not taken into account, the adopted individual RLAs in practice do not reflect the existing realities.




Mechanism 1

- **Taking into account** and process of conciliation of the local community interests during drafting budgets and making changes in the budget




Mechanism 2

- **Comprehensive planning of regional development** through adoption of law on comprehensive planning of regional development taking into account spacious planning and interaction of the state with LSGs




Mechanism 3

- **Comprehensive planning of sectoral development** (education, agriculture, etc.) with clearly defined role of local self-government and mechanisms of its interaction with the ministries and agencies in addressing sectoral issues



Mechanism 4

- **Delegation of powers** with provision of respective resources for execution of functions and service provision



Impact on governance:

- Performance of duties enshrined in the constitutional law for local self-government bodies.
- Quality improvement due to influence of decisions made on the equal development of regions.
- Increased trust of the local community to the Government.
- Strengthened social stability of society and increased socio-economic stability.
- Establishment of an agreed position between the state authority and the local self-government.
